*Somebody Spiked the Wassail* is a fun arrangement with a “neighborhood band that got a little buzzed at the party” theme. Based on the traditional carol *The Wassail Song* (or *Here We Come A-wassailing*), it's probably not the best choice for a Church concert!

The arrangement runs through several interesting variations, including March, Blues, Swing, Reggae, Classic Rock, and Waltz.

There are some optional vocals and drum set that can be added to the fun. The idea is that your volunteer carolers will come on stage midway through the piece, joining in with a few lines of Christmas lyrics sung to an old, familiar song. If the audience participates by shouting out a certain “T” word (or perhaps “Merry Christmas!”) at the appropriate time, the carolers respond with “We didn’t say Simon Says!” If the audience remains quiet the carolers avow in unison “We did NOT say that!” After this possibly inebriated moment, the carolers would exit during the waltz, grabbing a partner to dance off stage with (if desired).

The whole shtick can be omitted, with the piece performed as a stand-alone arrangement for Brass Quintet, or Brass Quintet and Drums.
